- 1) Introduction of board members.
- 2) About \$1300 to send out twice yearly meeting mailer for 3100 tax lots.

- 4) Some grant money might be available for bus shelter.
- 5) Surprise Presentation by Mayor Jim Clinton about Neighborhood Associations, and the startup of the SBNA (the first). Recognizing Mike for his years of volunteerism with the NA. Thank you Mike!
- 6) Speed Monitor Program – work in progress.
- 7) Baker Road stop signs will be permanent.
- 8) Brookwood cleanup team. Many thanks for your many volunteer hours over the summer!
- 9) Brookwood cleanup team. Many thanks for your many volunteer hours.
- 10) Speaker 1. Dave Howe – Battalion Chief. Introducing the 3 fire fighters from the visiting engine. Jeff Blake Battalion Chief. Dept. runs three shifts, work 48 hours on, and 96 hours off. Works with data to see which apparatus is the best to send to any given event. BLS, or basic life support, and ALS, advanced life support. Response times standards are time of call to exit building 90 seconds and 6-8 minutes to get to any location (80<sup>th</sup> percentile). Started BLS and quick response vehicle with paramedic as part of levy. Call breakdown is approximately 82-85% medical, 60% BLS. Actual fire calls can be 2-3% of all. A sixth station might go

near Bear Creek school and the Police Station area. They are working on getting a medical rig that can cover more medical calls from the southern station.

- 11) Drew Norris – BLS program director. Reduce response times, station reliability – having people to respond. Model came from Huntington Beach/Glendale. WE have Tumalo, south station, west station, east by Hamby, north by jail. Running this rig 24/7 since may 15<sup>th</sup>. Hired 14 EMT basics to do this. QRV medic goes with each call. Total of 22 personal on duty. In Jan 14<sup>th</sup> it will go to 24. 100 total. BFD trucks are 20 years old. Getting 6 new trucks. Peter Hossick – improvement of ALS. New concepts in CPR. Want to have more public take CPR. Bend had 20% survival rate of cardiac arrest in Bend. High performance CPR is the most important thing. Police often available 2-3 minutes before medics. They were just trained here in Bend and have many new AEDs. Now at 50% survival in Bend. Bend will become part of the Pulse Point App program!
- 12) Items to add to the agenda from concerned citizens.
- 13) Duane Oaks – Neighborhood concern about the property at the old Waldorf school property. Near Ponderosa, address is 19888 Rockinghorse Road. Sunriver Academy. Trash problem, people dumping trash, kids starting fires. Owned by Tammy Baney's husband who is a developer.
- 14) Speaking about Art in Public Places. Still trying to figure out if we can write a grant to get our own art in the Powers Round About.
- 15) Speaking about city sewer bills. Some residents have had much higher jumps in their sewer bills. Some over 40%!
